Academic Highlights

Spring Test Results.....We are **STILL on top of Macomb County!**

Armada had the top cumulative SAT score 1024.8- 18 points higher than the 2nd highest (Utica)

Armada had the highest EBRW and Math subscores, and we were the only district to break a cumulative average of 500 in Math. (2nd year in a row) Great job class of 2025!

How do we stack up against the BWAC/State/National?

Armada had the highest cumulative SAT score average in the BWAC

Armada High School is 80 points above the State Average and 73 points above the National Average for SAT

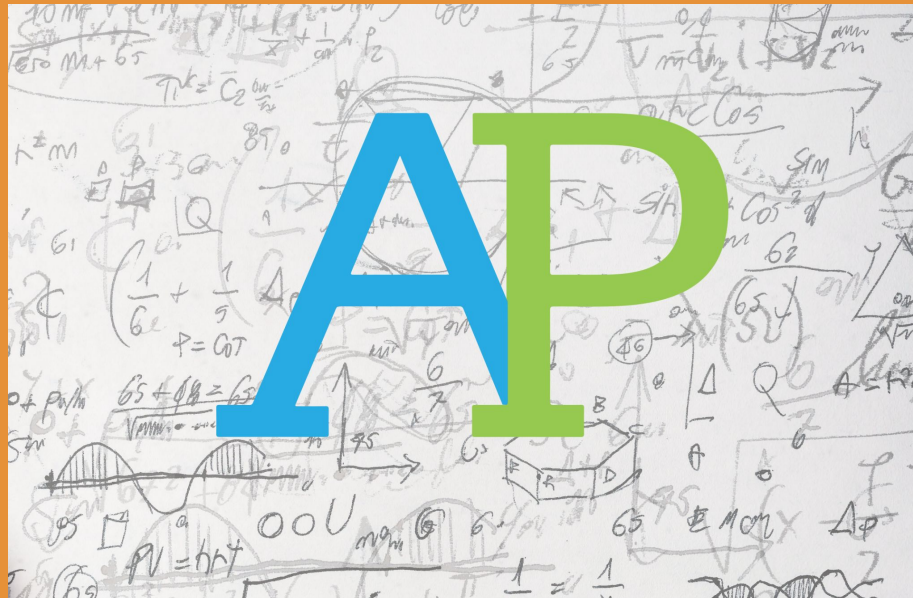

Advanced Placement Tests

23/24- 149 students were enrolled in at least 1 AP class, with many students being enrolled in multiple classes. 55% of our students took an AP test and received a score of 3 or better, leading to college credit.



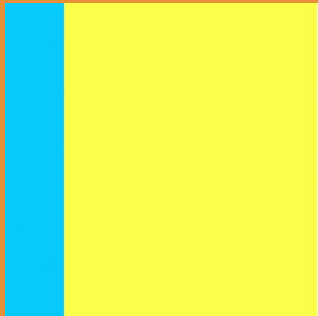
What is New at AHS?

Protecting our Educational Setting

Classroom Cell Phone Policy - AHS students and staff identified a problem and took action. Med Science and Leadership classes both assisted with surveys and information.

Effective 3/10/25- Students are not permitted to be on cell phones or use headphones in any capacity during classroom time.

Our goal is to maximize student engagement and focus while minimizing time off task and reduce social media related anxiety.



Tiger Stripes- PBIS

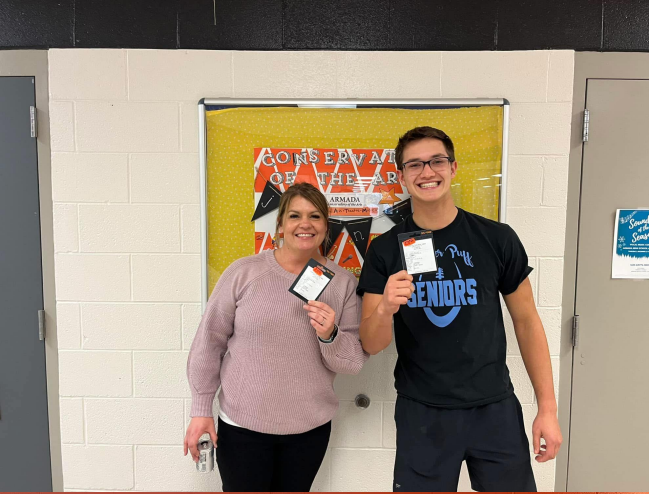
We have implemented the “Earn Your Stripes” PBIS program with great success.

Students can receive stripes from any staff member for exhibiting positive behaviors during the day.

At the end of each week, 5-10 names are randomly selected and students receive rewards and public recognition

At the end of each Trimester, Grand Prize winners are selected and one student and the staff member that nominated them, receive \$100 and \$25 gift cards. **So far we have honored almost 200 students for their positive contributions.**

We have seen an increase in positive behaviors, building cleanliness, and student ownership.



The Addition of the Tiger Lounge

Students and Staff now have the option to utilize our new “Tigers Lounge” throughout the day as an alternative place to work.

Utilized for small group work, Dual Enrollment students, and an alternative to the noise of the cafeteria during lunches.

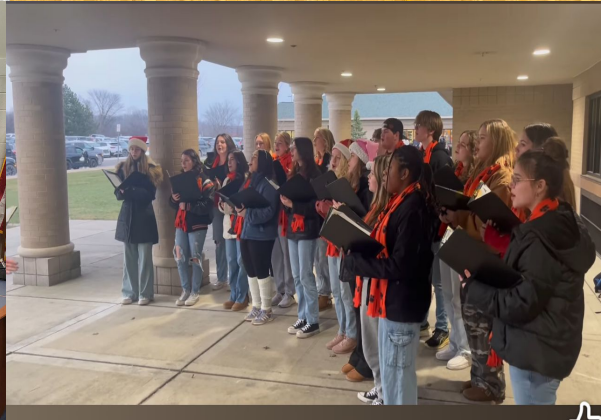
Armada High School is not a “ Sit and Get” High School. AHS students are actively engaged in the learning process and know that “it's ok to have fun at school”

Lunch Buddy Program

The Lunch Buddy Program is a peer to peer opportunity that's designed to have high school students as positive role models and mentors to a student at Krause Elementary School who may be identified as at-risk and/or in need of a positive influence/interactions.

- We have 22 high schoolers (9-12th grade) and 22 elementary students (kindergarten-2nd grade) participating
- Program is currently held bi-weekly on Thursdays
- Currently there is a waitlist of interested high school students
- This program is coordinated by High School Social Worker, Rory Ayotte. Lane Hurd is the elementary liaison for it.
