Superintendent's Report:

Mr. Musary shared the following information about the district's financial challenges:

- Loss of \$1.6 million ESSR funds
 - Utilized \$800,000 during both the 2022/23 and 2023/24 school years to reduce class size at the elementary school by hiring six additional teachers (one per grade).
 - Teachers remained on staff during 2024/25 and 2025/26.
 - K-5 average class size the last four school years:
 - 2022/23 21.6
 - 2023/24 23.0
 - 2024/25 24.7
 - 2025/26 24.9
- Loss of 32.51 students from last school year (\$326,725)
 - Fall 2024 FTE = 1,706.88
 - Fall 2025 FTE = 1,674.37
- \$0 per pupil funding increase from the State in 2024/25.
- Additional new staff hired over the past four school years:
 - Counselor in every building (1 new)
 - Security Liaisons in every building (4 new)
 - Social Worker in every building (3 new)
 - District Nurse (1 new)
 - Elementary Behavioral Specialist (1 new)

- Provided all employees with 4% raises for 24/25, 25/26, and 26/27 to reward staff for #1 academic school district in Macomb County for 8 consecutive years.
- Double digit health care percentage increases the last two calendar years.
- District General Fund Equity as of June 30, 2025 is \$1,744,312.
- District has 600 school of choice students (35%) from 20 other districts.
