


MTSS Program

Process:

- Stakeholder identifies student with potential need (MTSS Referral Google Form)
- MTSS team completes a data dig & determines academic impact


If participation in MTSS process is determined:

- Parent contact is made
- Tier 1 (classroom level) or Tier 2 (small group) interventions are put in place
- Student will have an open MTSS case & the MTSS Plan will be followed
